- ◆ Journals this section will contain journals labeled by chapter. See more information below.
- ♦ Quizzes this section will contain graded quizzes for the current chapter. You can use these for class discussion & review.

- Do not keep other classes' materials in your math notebook ... math "stuff" only.
- Make sure your name, my name, and our class title is on/in your notebook & textbook...just in case it is misplaced.
